## FROM OUR DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

#### The 31 bus

The County council's plan to remove 100% of bus subsidies and replace them with a new council-administered localised transport scheme, is turning its attention to the 31 bus. Under this county wide plan, the council will save £1.7million. However, 2 years into the project, no new viable bus

transport schemes have yet been established.

It was hoped that this delay would have put any changes to the 31 bus route on hold, but it seems that the council still wants to move ahead with its cuts schedule.

Susan has received an assurance that the post-16 education transport service provided by the 31 bus will be protected , but it is unclear how. Equally important are daily scheduled journeys for work commuters and essential access to public services.

In response to criticism that this project threatens to undermine the already thin network of public transport in rural areas, the council leader has given assurance that no subsidized bus will be removed before a solution is found and whatever replaces the 31 will provide an "even better service than before".

Now the rescue has a managing committee and gained charity status last year.
