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## CHISHILL PARISH COUNCIL, NOVEMBER 2013 COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT

- 1. The County's chief finance officer has said he would be happy to visit any parish council that would like a brief presentation on the county's budget situation, or a chance to ask questions.
- 2. The county council is working well towards reconstituting itself under a service area committee system, to replace the old cabinet system which tends to recycle the same people around the top table year after year. Already its work is more transparent and councillors are probably better informed. The involvement of a wider range of people in decision-making means that potentially, more expertise can be drawn upon.
- 3. The Melbourn Hub and our library access point are due to open sometime very early in the New Year. The entire transfer of books to the new premises will be done by volunteer staff and any help on this front will be gratefully received.
- 4. Many people are reporting **pot hole accidents** and damage to their cars. Here is the on-line system for applying for compensation: <a href="http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/transport/roads/highways/">http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/transport/roads/highways/</a>
- 5. 31 bus. The county council has emphasized that it will not remove any subsidized bus service until a new transport solution has been worked out and is ready to go. Roughly 40% of the old subsidy

should be available, though the council is reluctant to work on exact figures and is saying that it has 40% of the previous overall budget to work with, county-wide. The 31 has a particularly important role as it serves the education transport needs for 16-19 year olds. From ridership and subsidy figures presented in March 2012: the 31 bus receives £78,894 per year in subsidy. It carried 19,026 passengers and the average cost per passenger journey was £4.15. This is not exorbitant when compared against other subsidized bus journeys in the county.

## TRADING STANDARDS ADVICE ON BUYING A SECONDHAND CAR

#### Check before you buy:

The validity of the MOT on VOSA's website (<a href="www.gov.uk/check-mot-status">www.gov.uk/check-mot-status</a>) and check the car's details are correct on the MOT certificate. If it states there were advisory points, make sure you see the details so that you know what work is likely to be needed before the next MOT.

**VOSA** website to check the vehicle has not been recalled.

Service history. How often has it been serviced, and has it been serviced in line with the manufacturer's recommendations? Carry out an HPI (www.hpi.co.uk) check to make sure there is no outstanding finance on the car that could lead to its being repossessed by the finance company. An HPI check will also tell you if the car has been written off or if it is stolen.

Physically check the car, carry out a walk around check and test drive the car. If you are not mechanically minded we would also strongly recommend you have the car checked by an engineer.


