BUT ALSO:

TAKING A MORE DIRECT APPROACH TO TACKLING SPEEDING

We have lived in Gt Chishill for over 5 years now, opposite the Village Hall which is regularly used by dog walkers, ramblers and families visiting the fields and the playground. At this end of the village there are no pavements and all of us walk next to/on the road which makes us all particularly vulnerable to speeding traffic. I regularly cross the road with 2 small children and the speed of lorries and vans has made me particularly angry. So I decided to tackle the problem. Over the past few months whenever I have seen a commercial vehicle obviously speeding anywhere in the village I have taken a mental note of the company, the time and the direction they were travelling and have telephoned the company to inform them. There have been some fantastic results.

When I call the main telephone number listed online I am warm, polite and friendly - and I ask for their help. I am clear that I'm not out to cause trouble but that the potential danger is too important to ignore. I describe the risk that speeding in a 30mph zone imparts particularly to our children. I ask to speak to the Operations Manager/Customer Services manager and am quickly connected. They then ask me for more details. In all cases the person I've spoken to has been unfailingly polite and

apologetic and has guietly agreed that it needs to stop. They confirm they will identify who was at fault and speak to them, and all their drivers, to remind them all of the impact speeding can have on a community and the danger it imposes. I remind them of the negative PR a speeding vehicle has on their company which helps reinforce things. In several cases a more senior manager has called back to apologise. So far we - the residents - have had a sincere apology from Waitrose, Ocado, ASDA, Tesco, Herts Skips, Pickfords and Ridgeons to name a few. In some cases (notably Ridgeons Saffron Walden) the manager has offered me a significant discount next time I am in store by way of an apology. Impressive.

I would encourage anybody who sees a commercial vehicle speeding to do the same. Calling a skip hire company or a building firm to complain about one of their boys speeding might feel daunting the first time you do it, but it really is so worthwhile.

Whilst it is difficult to say what bearing this may have on speeding in our village, I believe a call like this at least raises the profile of the issue within the company concerned and could prevent an accident in another village or residential area by making the drivers think more carefully. It also helps me stop being so angry as I feel I'm DOING something about it. And for anyone who fancies doing the same but is not sure how to go about it - do get in touch. I'm trained in

conflict management and would happily coach you through it.
