MELBOURN CHILDREN'S CENTRE: SPARE BABY CAR SEATS NEEDED Melbourn's Pippins Children's Centre is now firmly established in new premises adjacent to Melbourn Primary School. It is open to anyone expecting a child or with children ages 0-5, and all activities are free of charge.

### COMMUNITY TRANSPORT FUNDS HELD FROM COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

Susan's motion to the county council earlier this month, calling for the dissemination of its one-off £258K community transport grant from government to established community transport providers, was voted down. The council's ruling group is holding the funds for

potential use in its new publicly subsidized, profit-based franchise pilots known as Cambridgeshire Future Transport. Only one pilot has commenced ('Duxford Local Links,' earlier this month) but is now experiencing a two-week break, and has yet to carry out research on local transport needs.

### COUNTY COUNCIL BUS CONSULTATION RESULTS DUE JANUARY 12

Results of the County Council's recent bus consultation, which followed a threat of judicial review to the administration's February 2011 decision to cut 100% of bus subsidies, will be examined at the Overview and Scrutiny Committee meeting January 12<sup>th</sup>, 3pm. This is a public meeting and you can submit a question. Please contact scrutiny@cambridgeshire.gov.uk for details.

We will be pressing the administration to reconsider its planned withdrawal of subsidies, especially in light of the fact that no suitable alternative transport arrangements have been worked out for vulnerable groups, including the infirm, the young, and all those who cannot afford private transport.

## ADDENBROOKES ACCESS ROAD: CLARIFICATION

Visitors to Addenbrooke's from our villages have reported confusion about rules for accessing the new link road from Hauxton Road (A1309) and Shelford Road. There are two classifications of the new road network. The inner link road that surrounds the Addenbrookes site is privately owned and monitored by an Automatic Number Plate Recognition system, to prevent rat running to Long Road. The ANPR system records the details of vehicles entering and exiting the hospital site within a specific

period of time and can trigger a penalty. This inner road is meant for drivers of any vehicle accessing the site for legitimate reasons (staff, patients, visitors, friends) and we are assured that they should experience no difficulties.

The outer section of the new link road is a public road and anyone can use it. If you want to try it out, there is a roundabout at the critical point allowing you to go back to where you came from.

### BLUE BADGE SYSTEM

The government has announced new arrangements around the administration of the Blue Badge system, and Cambridgeshire County Council will be reviewing any necessary adjustments in its own management of the service. We have been assured that current badge-holders and legitimate applicants for new badges will be able to access this service in a straightforward manner, as before. We will be watching carefully.

In May elections will be held for a new parish council.

The Parish Council is the vehicle intended to represent the interests and concerns of the community at a local level, to use Precept funds to promote clubs, societies and improvement projects, give a balanced and fair view on planning applications and liaise with the District and County Council to ensure their services provision is to an acceptable standard.

The Localism Bill has just received Royal Assent. This gives Parish Councils greater influence in areas such as planning, specifically the development of neighbourhood plans, the control of public assets, aspects of highways management, and, in principle a general power of competence to deliver more for the community.
