ASH DIEBACK is caused by a fungus causing leaf loss, lesions on the bark and dieback of the crown of the common ash tree. The disease is spread by spores from the fruiting bodies of the fungus on dead leaves, usually killing the tree.

To check the spread of this, the Woodland Trust asks that when visiting woods we do not remove any plant material, on leaving and before visiting other countryside sites or parks, clean mud etc. from boots and tyres.
