THE WINDMILL TURNS TO THE FUTURE

Last year saw only slow progress with the windmill restoration plan but we did pass another major milestone. The tail structure and mechanism were repaired and tested and, on Sunday September 27th, Bill Griffiths, our millwright, untied the mill and let a stiff NE wind spin the fantail to turn the mill on its post about 120°. If you drove past in the following week you couldn't fail to notice the new view the windmill presented.

Further tests in gentle breezes showed that the mill turns quite easily and at the time of writing it is tied up once more, but facing south. There are still safety measures to be applied, not least woodwork to cover the wheels and driving gear, but we hope that the mill turning to face the wind will soon become the norm. Of course, we need to carry out risk assessments before we can decide if this will be for demonstration only or if the mill can be allowed to turn automatically. As it is the only open-trestle postmill in the country with a tail mechanism, it would be a unique sight to see it carefully following the wind as it changes direction.



People ask us about the main sails, but they are completely separate from the tail mechanism and will not be turning anytime soon as a further significant restoration programme is required to put them in working order.

The immediate priorities for the Windmill Trust are to establish a safe routine for allowing the mill to turn to wind and to create a steady income to fund planned maintenance (like cleaning the paintwork of fungus that has grown rather too quickly!) We are, however, very pleased that we enter 2021 in a good position to achieve both of these targets. We thank you for your continued interest and support and wish you all a very Happy New Year.

CHURCH REORDERING UPDATE

The work at St Swithun's is progressing well and we hope it will be complete by the end of February. At one end of the



church the chancel ceiling has been stripped down to the beams. It is being replastered with lime and horsehair plaster and repainted. At the other end of the church a new kitchen facility is being installed to create a community area. At the moment the flooring is underway, then the plumbing and new electrics have to be fitted. Quite a task given the very thick church walls which have to be drilled through!

Angela Patrick-Sutcliffe is selling pretty bottle lights to raise money for the church building; these are proving to be very popular by those who have already bought them.

If anyone would like to buy one or two to brighten up their homes during the dark nights, they are £10 each, all the money being raised will go to the building fund.

ARE YOU PAYING TOO MUCH FOR WATER?

Does your house rainwater go to soakaways? Check with Cambridge Water you are not being charged for it going down the sewage drain. waterinfo@cambridge-water.co.uk. You could get six years rebate and reduced future bills.

Are you on a meter and use water for the garden (or Playing Fields) from an unmetered outside tap? You are paying for water to go down the sewer. Just a small approved meter on the outside tap and you can claim an abatement from Anglian Water and a reduction in wastewater charges, as there is less going down the sewer.
