PARKING IN WALLER'S CLOSE, CHISHILL It is disappointing that neither the District nor County Councils has been able to find ways of increasing the number of parking spaces in this close. Chishill Parish Council has been very active in making representations to improve the situation.

31 BUS SERVICE AT RISK:

STILL NO NEWS FROM COUNTY COUNCIL There is still no information whatsoever about the future of the 31 bus (Barley-Chishill-Heydon-Addenbrooke's-Cambridge), run by Meridian Line and on the list of County bus subsidy cuts. The County Council is holding a series of discussions about the future of transport in Cambridgeshire, but County Councillors, as local representatives, are not allowed to attend. This is particularly ironic considering the expectation that local communities will devise their own local transport systems. Many unanswered questions persist, especially about where the money will come from.

After nearly a year of putting pressure on Network Rail, who is responsible for all level crossings, the out-dated and sometimes faulty pedestrian gates at Foxton Level Crossing are being replaced. Work has started and should be finished by about July 1st. Thank you again to everyone who has taken the trouble to get in touch with details of experiences with the faulty gates, which created an extremely dangerous environment. It was indeed difficult to understand why the very organization which reminds us not to take risks at level crossings allowed these gates to remain in use long past their sell-by date.
