NRS Healthcare is the provider of the community equipment loan service for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, operating from a service centre in Huntingdon. We provide products or 'daily living aids' on behalf of Cambridgeshire County Council for people who may have had a spell in hospital, have a disability or injury, and require equipment in the home to help them live independently.

With support from
Cambridgeshire County Council,
we are offering an information
and advice service to residents
of the county who are not
eligible to have community
equipment provided on loan and
so may need to purchase
equipment themselves. Many
people are unaware that there
are products that can help them

to increase their independence at home. The service is designed to help residents understand what products or 'daily living aids' they need (for example, through the use of assessments online or over the telephone) and to signpost them to reliable local and national suppliers from where they can buy the products. NRS Healthcare is one of the purchase points, but there are many local shops and other online retailers supplied as options.

NRS is developing a Safe+Well website at the moment, due to go live at the beginning of July. The website is a portal for people to access the information and assessment options they prefer as well as details about where to buy. The service and assessment options are provided free of charge, except for an Occupational Therapist home visit option which is chargeable to the client.

### GOVIA: NEW TRAIN COMPANY LISTENS TO US

In mid-September First Capital Connect will cease to run trains between Cambridge and King's Cross, and Govia will take over. This 'Thameslink' franchise will be the biggest in the country, connecting King's Lynn and Brighton. Therefore it is vital that our small stations continue to keep on the radar. Last autumn the Meldreth, Shepreth and Foxton Rail User Group met with Govia and other shortlisted franchise bidders to make our aspirations known. Establishing an early relationship paid off and Govia has confirmed to us that they will continue to honour the 50% 16-19 year-old rail discount which Susan negotiated with First Capital Connect.

### POST-16 TRANSPORT: OPTIONS AND APPLICATIONS

Anyone aged 16-18 headed to sixth form or further education or training can choose from several transport options, outlined at <a href="https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk">www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk</a>. Those wishing to travel by public bus can apply for a pass which is partially subsidized, at a cost of £xxx per year. Those wishing to travel by bicycle are entitled to a £40 per term payment to help maintain their bicycle.

Those wishing to travel by train from Meldreth, Shepreth or Foxton can apply for a Cambridgeshire Student Discount fare which costs significantly less than County-subsidized bus travel. The FCC fare cannot be purchased until students are certain of their college destination, so for many that will mean from August 22 onward.
