GREAT CHISHILL PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION

This voluntary group of people look after the fields and the surrounds including the children's playground. We provide all of our own equipment and supply our time free of charge to enable this work to continue.

We receive a grant from the Parish Council that covers insurance policies and part of the water rates.

Our annual costs include equipment servicing, field dressings and general maintenance to the pavilion which amount to approximately £5,000. (Playing Fields Assoc. cont.)
Rents and grass cutting
fees together with the PC
grant meet a proportion of
these fixed costs.

A large proportion of our income is derived from fund raising.

Because we have had to purchase a "new" second hand tractor at a cost of £4,800 this year, we shall have to work really hard to raise funds to cover our costs. So we are holding an

evening garden fete on Friday 20th July at 29 HEYDON ROAD.
