

RINGERS' DELIGHT

18 Chishill and Heydon bellringers, church and hand, piled into Drayton's minibuses on May 15th to visit Whitechapel Bell Foundry, to deliver and collect bells and do a tour. The Foundry, which has been in existence since the 1400's and moved to Whitechapel in 1738, is the oldest Company in England. The manufacturing site is tiny, about the size of a large suburban house and garden. It is a maze of workshops: foundry, tuning shop, assembly and carpentry and a precision area for hand bells. We saw Meldreth bells being renovated alongside a venerable bell of 1480, before Columbus sailed. A longer description is in the Village Web but all found the visit extraordinary and fascinating.
