It is regrettable to report again, the overboisterous activities of group of "lads" who tried to gain access to Village Hall on the 5th February at around 20.30. This resulted in the organiser having to refuse entry and in the process, damage to the door entry mechanism occurred, A repair bill of several hundreds of pounds has been the inevitable outcome. The incident was distressing for the event organiser and disturbing to the Village Hall Committee. The Police have been informed of the incident. This together with vandalism to the Pavilion means that repair costs are running into thousands of pounds.

It would be very beneficial to understand the background to such incidents and the reasons why they took place.

The Youth Club is currently very active and the Parish Council would like to encourage the formation of a "Youth Committee" where the views, interests and needs of the 10 -16 year olds could be represented and incorporated into facilities provide by the village. If you are, or have children, in this age group, and feel that more should be done to represent them, please contact the Youth Club or a member of the Parish Council so that we can work together to provide facilities for all residents without disturbing the harmony of the village. As part of the on-going dialogue with interested parties, the Local PCSO will be attending the Youth Club in the coming weeks. WHO DOES WHAT IN THE VILLAGE?

GREAT CHISHILL PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION

A committee of village people representing the football and cricket clubs plus other elected villagers look after and maintain the entire playing fields and the Plaistow area on behalf of the village and the various clubs that use the facilities.

The current committee members are Simon Coxall, Andrew Drury, Jeff Gill, Martin Levy, Stephen Saunders, Mark Wright and Darrel Plumb.

Simon Coxall masterminds all of the much appreciated work and is assisted by the committee as well as Garry Wright, Alan Parkes and Dick Sanderson. The playing fields were voted in the recent village survey as one of the most valuable village amenities. The annual cost of maintaining the playing fields, including the necessary equipment and the buildings is approximately £7,000. The yearly income is approximately £4,000 (this includes the parish council grant) which leaves a shortfall of £3,000. This is raised annually by various fund raising events which are organised by the hard-working committee and, in turn, supported so generously by people living within the village. Since 2004 nearly £50,000 has been spent on projects such as a complete pavilion refurbishment, a new storage shed, flood-lights for evening football training, basketball

equipment, replacement mowers, and a new tractor.

Sadly, here has recently been some evidence of vandalism and theft, which is a shame, and one hopes that these are isolated incidents. However, they all have to be repaired which adds unnecessarily to our costs.

We hope that you all continue to enjoy this wonderful village amenity. Stephen Saunders
