Much concern

has been voiced about the number of vehicles that exceed the 30m.p.h speed limit through the village. The aim of **Speedwatch** is to provide advice to speeding motorists to improve driver behaviour. It is a police initiative which has been adopted by Neighbourhood Panels. For it to work, local volunteers are needed. Now is your chance to volunteer to use a Speed Watch **Detection Unit**. Training will be given in using this loaned device. Data will be gathered whilst logging the speed and registration number of any car as it speeds through the village. Speeders will then be sent a letter by the police.
