In the meantime, faced with an obdurate County Council and national cuts, the Parish Council is seeking help from bodies such as English Heritage who are more than aware of the state of the mill and have experience in financing the upkeep of such buildings. There has never been a question of the Parish Council's acquiring the wind mill. Unfortunately, the County Council is making heavy cuts in all sectors and wind mills don't get a look in.

#### CHISHILL YOUTH CLUB

As of the new financial year, our Youth Club will no longer receive funding from the County Council. They have cut a £3 million youth budget by £1 million and do not have the money to provide any regular open access clubs, such as Chishill, on top of the "targeted" work.

The Parish Council's £1,000 grant is only sufficient to fund one youth worker for a limited number of weeks a year, yet any more given to the Youth Club would mean that the youth of the village would be receiving a disproportionate amount of money. There is external funding available for things such as equipment but not salaries; money for icing but not for cake.

The Youth Club Committee, in a changing minefield of finance, is looking to joint-funding with Melbourn and its surrounding villages.

### DISABLED CHILDREN'S ACCESS TO CHILDCARE

The Cambridgeshire County Council Disabled Children's Access to Childcare (DCATCH) project is aimed at supporting parents/carers of disabled children in accessing suitable childcare; enabling them the chance of returning to employment and/or training. It is part of the Cambridgeshire Childcare Information Service (CIS).

The aim of the project is to work closely with parents, childcare providers and professionals, embedding the principles of DCATCH; ensuring inclusion into early years and childcare settings for all. A referral service to parents shows where to go for support and guidance with their childcare options via the Childcare Brokerage Service.

Once a family is identified we can then, through the CIS Childcare Brokerage Service, enquire about suitable childcare. This will include information on provision of childcare from providers, funding options, costs, specialist care and specialist facilities, if required by the provider.
