BYWAYS, BRIDLEWAYS AND FOOTPATHS

Great and Little Chishill Parish Council belongs to something called the Parish Paths Partnership or P3. The partnership is between the Parish Council and the County and District councils and its function is to improve, maintain and promote public rights of way. Each year the parish puts forward a grant request which may or may not be awarded depending on whether or not the bid is in keeping with the County Council's envisaged programme and how much money is available that year. In addition to the County Council's statutory duty to 'protect and assert the public's existing rights of access', it has the following priorities:

- Making the countryside more accessible to everyone
- Making the RoW network safer to use

- Preventing new development from damaging the RoW network
- Providing up-to-date, accurate and user friendly information about access
 - Joining up the RoW network by filling in the gaps
 - Making sure the definitive map {the legal documents for RoW} and other records are reliable, accurate and easy to use
 - Managing access with farming, conservation, heritage and crime in mind
- Making using the RoW network straightforward, enjoyable and inspiring

Their job is to act as a channel of communication between the Parish Council and the District Council. Let them know if you notice anything on our rights of way that you think needs attention. They hope to put a map of the rights of way in our Parish on the web in the not too distant future.

N.B. It may not have come to your notice that we now have greater access to the countryside via 'conservation walks' – a network of permissive bridleways for use by both horse riders and walkers and set up by DEFRA. **Maps of where you can walk are on the gate leading to the fields at the end of the Pudgell and also on the field nearly opposite number 49 Barley Road.**
