On 2nd Feb 2009, the Contact Centre began changing its telephone numbers so that each of the public facing 0845 numbers has a new number beginning with 0345.

The remaining structure of each number will remain the same as before e.g.

Cambridgeshire County Council's 'General Enquiries' number will change from 0845 045 5200 to 0345 045 5200.

The 03 number range has been introduced by Ofcom as an alternative to 08 numbers due to concerns by the public relating to call charges. 0345 numbers cost the same as calls to geographic numbers (starting 01 or 02) and will be included as part of relevant inclusive call bundles or discount schemes that customers may have with their service provider.

0845 numbers will be phased out in August.
