STREET LIGHTING FOLLOW-UP: ALL VILLAGES

A huge number of lessons have been learned from the street lighting work carried out in Meldreth and Melbourn, where individual case work is still ongoing. Senior officers at Balfour Beatty resigned following difficulties in implementing the County Council's street lighting contract in our area and the new team has been receptive to concerns, particularly around communication and public safety.

MORE CHOICE IN SOCIAL CARE

Social care is provided to people who have been assessed as having substantial or critical support needs with personal care, getting meals, managing medication and staying safe.

If you need social care, the County Council will arrange your care for you, but they now have a duty to offer and provide Direct Payments.
Direct Payments are an alternative way of getting the care and support you need. They are cash payments made directly into a Direct Payment bank account so that you can use the money to make your own

social care arrangements.
