Cambridge American Cemetery & Memorial, Madingley

'Faces of Cambridge' – May 27-28

Memorial Day is the US equivalent of Remembrance Sunday. This year, Cambridge American Cemetery is taking as its theme, the 75th Anniversary of the arrival of American service personnel in the East of England. It was known as the 'Friendly Invasion', as around 3.5 million Americans passed through Britain 1942-early 1946.

Many of them never made it home – 3,812 are buried in British soil; a further 5,127 are commemorated on the longest US Wall of the Missing in Europe. Researchers, both at the cemetery and all over the US and Europe have been striving to put a face to the names carved in stone, to find out their history, tell

their story and honour their sacrifice.

They were very young, those brave Americans who gave their lives in WWII, for the freedoms we enjoy today. Come and celebrate their lives as we put over 3,600 faces to their headstones, and Wall of the Missing, for one very special Memorial Day Weekend.
