This time last year we had a dozen burglaries but only one was reported on the Police Alert website. Robin Dibblee, who leads the Parish Council's newly formed Security Subcommittee, told the Newsletter: "So we have decided to set up our own Early Alert, which will give participating residents warning of any future incidents. The data of participants will be GDPR (revised Data Protection Act) - compliant, managed securely within the District Council database. We will be giving a Security Committee report to the Parish Council AGM on 11th May, so if you have any questions on the Scheme or Security in general, do come along. And you are also invited to a FREE Wine & Crime Evening on October 26th at 7.30 pm, where there will be a variety of Security topics tackled - in a fun context."

### VILLAGE DEFRIBILLATOR



The village now has an Automatic Electronic Defibrillator (AED). This is situated in a secure cabinet on the wall of the sports pavilion facing the car park. The AED was donated to the village by the Friends of Royston and District Healthcare and kindly installed by Andy Brown.

The AED will shortly be logged into the national emergency services database. Therefore, should someone dial 999 following an incident of cardiac arrest, they will be advised as to location of their nearest AED and given a code to unlock the cabinet. The AED once switched on gives easy to follow verbal instructions for the user and will not operate if the victim has any heartbeat, therefore they are totally safe to use so long as the instructions are followed.

Should you ever be in a position where someone has suffered a cardiac arrest then CPR should be performed and someone else should collect the AED after telephoning the emergency services. CPR should continue to be performed until the emergency services arrive should the AED following several attempts not have restarted the victim's heart.

We hope to arrange a CPR and AED training session in the near future for those in the village who are interested.
