ELITE CYCLING IN GREAT CHISHILL

The world's very best professional cyclists will return to Essex on Friday 24 and Saturday 25 May in one of the highest profile sporting events hosted by the county in 2024.

The Ford RideLondon Classique is a UCI Women's WorldTour event – the highest level of professional cycling – and sees the best female cyclists in the world race over three days for the right to be crowned champion.



On Friday 24 May, thousands will pack the streets of Saffron Walden to watch the start of the race at 11am. Beginning in Market Square, the riders

will roll out towards Great Chishill, via Elmdon and Heydon, before making their way towards Barley and onwards. arriving at the finish on East Hill in Colchester at around 3pm.

Roads in Great Chishill will be closed from 11.05 to 11.40 that morning.

The Classique, which is a London 2012 Olympics legacy event, will finish in London on Sunday 26 May.

The elite teams taking part include the best female team in the world, team SD Worx-Protime.
