# Volume 2 Issue 8 Advanced Driving Test

Hertfordshire County Council's Road Safety Unit is running a five week course in Baldock, starting on November 3. The classes will be held at Brandles School. Weston Way, Baldock on Mondays from 7.00 - 9.00pm, with a practical assessment and demonstration drive on Sunday November 30. The course covers a variety of advanced driving techniques and aims to raise driving standards and reducing road accidents and driving offences. Advanced drivers are 50 per cent less likely to be involved in a collision and passing an advanced driving test can also lead to better deals from insurance companies The practical assessment is

run in partnership with the North Herts/South Beds group of RoSPA Advanced Drivers & Riders Association (RoADAR), with demonstration drives by Hertfordshire Police Instructors.

The course costs £50, which included all textbooks and the practical assessment, with a concession rate of £40 for students and people who are retired, unemployed or receiving benefits.


