The Exchange in Chrishall (which serves our

community) had fibre optic cables fitted (replacing the old copper ones), so this is as upgraded as it is likely to be for the coming future. If poor speeds are encountered, it could be down to the lines into the individual's house, the equipment (routers, hubs etc) and even how the computer is set up as regards the position of the hub or router in the household. Please contact your service provider if you are encountering problems.

BT is currently in the early stages of trialling a new service in a couple of areas of the country which will enable very high speeds (up to 50mbs or more). Once all the testing and quality issues are complete it will roll out nationwide, starting in larger cities and towns initially. It will be a good few years before it reaches Great and Little Chishill.

Even so, with speeds of 2mbs it is still possible to upload/download/surf/email/go gaming successfully without encountering issues. The Government recommended minimum connection speed is also 2MB's. Sarah Scott

HEYDON AND CHISHILL GRITTING

The County Council's gritting schedule for the coming winter has been published with no change for Heydon and the Chishills. Great and Little Chishill Parish Council is looking into ways of accommodating those streets not included on the County schedule (May Street and Little Chishill). One possible solution is for the Parish Council to purchase grit bins for these areas. The County Council would replenish the bins with grit, but residents would be responsible for spreading the grit. This will be discussed in further detail at the next parish council meeting. In severe weather, as encountered last year, these roads will be gritted by the County Council gritting team.
