INTRODUCING THE BELSTEAD HERD OF LINCOLN REDS



Around the village you may have seen or heard our cows and many people have stopped us to ask about them so we thought you may like a bit more information.

We took over the tenancy of Lynchets Farm in the village from Terry Ingle in October 2009 and the cows arrived in October 2010 once grazing land had been found.

Why Lincoln Reds?

They are our favourites! And Robin is a Lincolnshire lad who grew up working on the farm where ours were bred. They are a native British breed that are docile, easy-calving and do well living out in all weathers. They produce quality succulent beef. It's so good they sell it in Harrodsl

Why Belstead Herd?

The herd is named after the Late RT Hon Lord Belstead our former employer who loved his farm and suckler herd which included Lincoln Reds. foundation cows are Donington Jessie and Donington Gloria and

they have two steer calves at The bull's nickname is foot. Bison (Anwick Debonair).

Our intention is to increase the herd but as pedigree Lincoln Red cows are very expensive we shall keep any heifer calves that we breed and rear any steers for beef. So it could be a while before we have a good number!

The cows spend the majority of their time out grazing but come in during deepest winter to stop the pasture turning to mud. When they are in they are fed on hay made from around the village including Bull Meadow. They are reared traditionally with no bought-in feed being used.

CHALLENGE TO COUNCILLOR PAY RISE

There has been much publicity about last week's County Council's decision to increase councillor allowances by 25%.

The allowance rise was recommended by an Independent Remunerations Panel and taken forward by the Leader of the Council. Political groups took a free vote: all Conservatives but four voted for the increase, while all Liberal Democrats but one voted against it. Subsequently the procedures around the setting up of the Independent Remunerations Panel have been challenged, and the timing of the implementation of the new policy was found to be incorrectly advised - to take effect next April, not. The decision has now immediately been challenged by a Liberal Democrat motion, calling for the new policy to be rescinded.
