VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

In October a very positive meeting was held to discuss the future of the village hall. The meeting was facilitated by the Village Hall Committee and in attendance were representatives from the Parish Council, PFA, Chishill Chimps and Youth Group. It is policy that every society that uses the village hall should have a representative on the Village Hall Committee and part of the rationale of this piece is to publicise this.

The Village Hall Committee, in addition, has identified another four people who have offered their services to the committee.

The Village Hall will have a maintenance manager for a trial period of 6 months. This is being underwritten by the Parish Council. One of the first jobs will be to do a risk assessment/audit of the Village Hall and work out short, medium and long-term goals for the maintenance of the Hall. This is seen as a very positive move forward. In addition, it is hoped that

during half-term, some members of the greater community will get together for a Village Hall tidy-up.

As from this month the Youth Club will now meet in the Village Hall on Tuesday evenings (except when the WI holds their meetings). This has come about as the Great Chishill Nursery is returning to the pavilion, whence it came.


