GCCC Season 2024 Report

Great Chishill CC were crowned champions of the Cambridgeshire Cricket Association Junior League 2 South which was very welcome having been relegated from the league above last year, we consider CCA JL1S as our “natural habitat” so it is good to get a bounce back promotion. It was a long process having started indoor nets last year on 7th November. It is only the 6th piece of silverware the club has won in its history. We had 16 fixtures, won 11, cancelled 3, lost 2. Top run scorers were James Piper with 444 (also the top run scorer in the league), Alastair Cockerton with 222 and Richard Brunt with 175. Top wicket takers were Alastair Cockerton and Jeremy Woodcock with 18 and Lucas Ling with 17. In the main it was a wet summer with sticky wickets aiding the bowlers. We selected 32 players in 2024, 16 who live or have lived in the village.
