IS THIS AN END TO SLOW BROADBAND MISERY? YES? PROBABLY? WELL, PERHAPS

The Parish Council have been liaising with Connecting Cambridgeshire about the installation of Superfast Broadband in the village. They have told us that most of the village should be able to receive superfast broadband by the end of September 2015. The enhancement will enable many homes and businesses to receive at superfast speeds (minimum 24Mbps) while others will be able to receive fibre broadband speeds of between 2Mbps and 24 Mbps. (only 2mbps? I get that now!-Ed) The broadband speed you will get depends on a number of factors including the length of your line from the telephone exchange or green roadside cabinet, the line quality, and the equipment and internal wiring within your premises. To get superfast speeds you will need to subscribe to your internet provider's superfast broadband service - such as BT's Infinity. See the PC's website for updates.
