PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS SECURITY CONCERNS

The security of our village homes and their contents is moving higher on the agenda, it seems. The issue was debated at this year's Village Meeting, and the first visible result of that discussion was the Parish Council's security questionnaire which was recently sent to all residents. The last 12 months have certainly seen an alarming number of burglaries, but one difficulty is that nobody is sure exactly how many. Without that sort of information, it's not possible to assess just how big a problem the villages face. The Parish Council said: "Following recent burglaries in the village, Great and Little Chishill Parish Council would like your views as to whether you feel there should be some sort of Parish initiative

to reduce this risk in future. By burglaries we mean houses, outbuildings, vehicles or land entered and goods taken. We would be most grateful for your time in filling in and returning this form to the green post box by the bus stop. Thank you."

The deadline to return completed questionnaires is 3 September – so there isn't much time, and Parish Clerk Sarah Scott says she wants as full a response as possible, so that the survey can be truly representative of village opinion. 7 SEPTEMBER MEETING TO DEBATE HALL LANE HOUSING PLANS

A few months ago the Parish Council was approached by Bloomhall, a Cambridge property services company. They were looking to gauge the feeling of the Parish about developing the land on Hall Lane between Waller's Close and Colts Croft. Parish Council Chair James Coney said "At the time we suggested that if they intended to take this further they could come and talk to the Parish Council at a monthly meeting where they could provide us with some more details. We also suggested that they would be advised to present their proposals to the village in an open forum."

Bloomhall representatives came to the July Parish Council meeting to show some plans and drawings of what they thought the development might look like. The proposal is for about 14 houses of a mix of affordable and market dwellings ranging from 1-4 bedrooms. There is more information on this in the minutes of the July meeting on the Parish Council web site,

At this stage no formal planning application or preapplication has been made.

The PC advised that the next step should be to consult with the village generally, which has been arranged for **7.30pm on 7th September at the Village Hall.** "We would urge people to come along and find out more" said James Coney.

Where have the windmill sails gone?

David McKeown writes

There has been very real progress with our project in the last few weeks as evidenced by the scaffolding surrounding the mill, holes where weatherboards have been removed and the loss of the sails. We have good news to report on fundraising but then, almost inevitably, news of yet more repair work necessary. On the financial side of things, we have been granted almost £48,000 from various funders, plus the Windmill Dancing Group has raised £1800 and the Recipe Book made £1000. But the response to our 'Sponsor a Board' appeal has been absolutely magnificent: it has now topped £13000! Our millwright, Bill Griffiths, has never seen such community fund raising in his whole career. Thank you all - you saved us from having to call a halt to the work! However, the sting in the tail came from inspecting the timbers. The

corner uprights have rotted but Bill is cutting 50mm from their outer faces and 'plating' them with new green oak to give strength and a surface for attaching the new weatherboards. Of great concern is the main horizontal weather beam that supports the sail assembly. It has rotted and is no longer securely attached to the corner posts, hence the reason for removing the sails. Once the sail assembly is supported on jacks, the weather beam will be removed for repair and the addition of a steel joist to give real strength to the structure.

We need to raise a little more money now but we have much to celebrate, so let's concentrate on the fun first. We are holding a Celebration Supper and Music Night on Saturday September 23rd in the Village Hall. Get your tickets from Lindsey Crawford or Ann Lane as soon as possible - our last Music Night was a sell out!
