
Welcome

29 year old curate, Revd Will Lyon Tupman, based at Sawston and Babraham, collects used candles for a Swindon charity to be melted down, if necessary, and shipped as newly created candles to Ukraine, where they are spread through a network of charitable organisations. Church buildings and private homes now have a perfect way to 'recycle' their used candles. 40% of Ukraine's power supply has been damaged since the invasion by Russia, so the new candles are vitally useful for people. Are You Ready...

...for the end of analogue landlines?

Essex County Council's Digital Essex team wants to make residents in the parish aware that changes are coming to analogue landlines.

By 2027, traditional phone lines will be replaced by a digital landline service. This means that calls will be made over a broadband line.

For most residents, this change will be straightforward – you'll also get to keep your phone number. Your telephone provider will contact you before anything changes. It is important to respond and discuss what you need to do to ensure your service won't be affected.

The switch to digital landline services could affect some residents. If any of the following apply to you, or someone you know, make sure you contact your telephone provider:

- You don't have broadband
- You rely solely on a landline
- You use a personal alarm or healthcare device
- You live in an area with poor mobile signal
- You have additional needs
- If you're confused, worried, unsure, or have any questions, call your telephone provider.

The esteemed garden designer and now 7 time Gold medallist at RHS Chelsea Flower Show, entitled his article for our April '24 issue: 'A Greener Tomorrow'. Meanwhile, Peter's esteem for Lucy Winkett led to further research into the ministry of this interesting woman, as described in the December/January 24 Web.

Rather remarkably, in one of those amazing coincidences we occasionally encounter in life, Robert has actually been working with Lucy, to develop a garden for the RHS Chelsea Flower show! The Gold Medal winning show garden will form the basis of a restored, accessible outdoor space at Lucy's church, designed by Sir Christopher Wren. St James' Piccadilly. The space is intended to offer people the opportunity for tranquility and inspiration. The restoration forms part of the Wren project, this is a space where endeavours, environmental, social, creative and spiritual, entwine offering a holistic imaginative version of what it is to be human in a modern city. The Caravan Drop in and Counselling service in the garden is free, seven days a week, welcoming people from all walks of life. On the back wall of the St James's RHS Chelsea garden is a quotation from a former Rector William Temple:

'The church is the only institution in society that exists for the benefit of those who don't belong to it. A fitting motto to remember.'

Do you value your voice?

Have you noticed we have a natural urge to sing to infants rather than, say, play them the violin or (God forbid) the accordion? Unlike other musical instruments, the human voice is totally intimate: it's at the heart of being human, and builds social bonds. Why are some apparently-confident people so nervous of singing in public? Why do some feel scarred for life after being



cruelly told they "can't sing"? It's because, whether we use it to scream, soothe, express joy or grief, our voice is entirely personal: unlike that violin, it's not a mere extension of ourself, but an actual part of our body. By singing in groups, therefore, we can build confidence over this vulnerable aspect of our identity, while naturally creating bonds with each other. In a choir, individuals (just like Liverpool's melodious football fans) simultaneously experience strength in unity, validation of the self and amplification of purpose. And when a choir works "in harmony", we sing not just one tune but several parts, which express our differences and yet complement & enhance each other within a unified whole. At that pinnacle, our music-making begins to reflect the very balance of nature around us, the universe in whose context we exist – the "music of the spheres", to use a phrase coined by Pythagoras (who developed the tuning system on which our western music is based).

In our parish choir, therefore, we're attempting to convey perfection. Well okay, we have a go at it, anyway... It doesn't matter that we don't have the greatest voices in the world, or that we're "only human" – on the contrary, that's exactly what gives it meaning! In religious terms, singing in church symbolises our intimate openness with God; meanwhile, the musical achievement itself reflects the harmonies of God's creation. As we contribute our personal voice, we bond with others, feel the elation of being bigger than ourselves, and offer our result to something even greater than us. Our choir brings something special to the parish by performing 2 or 3 Choral Evensongs each year, plus 2 or 3 carol services in December. Choral

Evensong (an art which is dwindling in many churches) is a particularly special experience: a semi-concert led by the choir, in which very little is expected of the congregation. The result is that you're whisked into a meditational space: a perfect separation from daily chores.

I highly recommend that you come along to our next Evensong. Or, if you think you might fancy joining the parish choir itself, we welcome all enquiries – you just need a basic ability to read music notation, and the time to join a few rehearsals in the lead-up to each performance. Frankly, it's inspiring simply to spend time inside the walls of these fabulous old buildings in our parish – each with their own distinct atmosphere – and to become a living part of their long history.

RNLI Celebration



In celebration of its 200th anniversary, the Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI) was honoured with a prestigious royal garden party at Buckingham Palace. This special event, hosted by Princess Anne and the RNLI President, the Duke of Kent, paid tribute to the RNLI's remarkable history and the heroic efforts of its volunteers who have saved countless lives at sea since its inception in 1824. The Buckingham Palace garden party gathered an esteemed assembly of guests, including RNLI volunteers, supporters, and dignitaries. The serene palace gardens provided a fitting backdrop for the celebration, reflecting the grandeur and significance of the occasion. The event also featured a display of historical lifeboat artifacts and contemporary rescue equipment, highlighting the evolution of the RNLI's life-saving operations over two centuries. To avoid distracting the King (who had hoped to attend), an inshore lifeboat was moved so that he would not be distracted from receiving the Prime Minister, who that day announced the upcoming election.

The garden party was more than a celebration of the past; it was a recognition of the ongoing commitment and bravery of RNLI volunteers. It also emphasized the importance of legacies and donations in supporting the institution's mission. The garden party was attended by Robert Aggas (brother of our parish administrator) who is the Fleet Operations Manager for the RNLI. He was able to show the Duke of Kent the Atlantic 85 lifeboat (an inshore lifeboat) and also met with the Princess Royal and her husband Vice Admiral Sir Tim Laurence.



A Well Trodden Path

Why does local history interest me? Because these were the people who lived in our houses before us, walked the same lanes as us and stared across the same fields. Nowadays with the amazing resource online it is relatively straightforward to put together a family tree – maybe just an afternoon's work although I would recommend a



lot of double checking. But even then you may just end up with a list of names and dates. Where the magic really occurs is when you can bring those names to life and get to know something of the person themselves.

On the Chrishall website we have a list of the vicars of Chrishall Church going right back to 1100 and gradually some of those names are coming back to life. John Clerk, for example, listed as vicar in 1401. He was involved in an inquisition about his Ward John Helion, when John needed to prove his age to inherit. From the inquisition report we hear little homely details such as on Sunday 14th February 1379, John Clerk had dinner with John Morice and William Serle where they talked about building a new barn and John Clerk mentioned the baptism of John Helion.

In 1640 Thomas King apparently fell out with some of the parishioners when they refused to come to the communion rail but would only kneel where they sat, presumably making Thomas walk round the church to them!

In 1839 Godfrey Everth wrote poetry whilst ministering to the Chrishall faithful and in 1881 Edmund Leachman was inducted into his new parish in "the usual manner" which involved locking him in the church until he rang the bells!
