A Reflection from Anand

The UK was shocked on Friday 15 October to hear the news of the brutal killing of Sir David Amess. A person has now been charged with his murder and also charged with the preparation of terrorist acts.

Sir David was much loved and appreciated by the community and for his dedication to his constituency for over 40 years. He was a devout catholic and stood without compromise for his moral principles. Many MPs paid emotional tributes saying that the killing was a tragic and senseless death of one of the gentlest individuals to serve in Parliament. Our deepest condolences and prayers go out to the bereaved family and may God console and comfort them in their loss.

In the modern world, any religion that promotes killing of another human being in the name of religious faith should be condemned. Indeed, in the Bible (*Exodus 20:13*), it is the sixth commandment of God which prohibits any human murder. However, when it comes to the New Testament teachings, Jesus radically redefined what 'murder' means. To Jesus, it means hating someone in our hearts. Jesus said (*Matthew 5:21,22*),

"You have heard that our ancestors were told, 'You must not murder. If you commit murder, you are subject to judgment'. But I say, if you are even angry with someone without cause, you are subject to judgment! If you call someone an idiot, you are in danger of being brought before the court. And if you curse someone you are in danger of the fires of hell'. Jesus explained the sixth commandment from God's perspective. In God's sight, even unrighteous anger or verbal abuse against someone was subject to the same judgment as taking that person's life.

The Bible says, 'the heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it? I, the Lord, search the heart and examine the mind, to reward each person according to their conduct, according to what their deeds deserve' (Jeremiah 17:9,10).

The killer's motivation may come from a deceitful interpretation of his religious ideologies and I hope and pray that he will repent for what he has done and reflect on his heinous crime.

Please to Remember the Fifth of November



The Conspirators.

"Please to remember the fifth of November, gunpowder, treason and plot. We know of no reason why gunpowder treason should ever be forgot."

This traditional rhyme appeared soon after the failed plot to ignite barrels of gunpowder beneath the House of Lords on the occasion of the state opening of Parliament by King James I on 5 November 1605.

The man found with the gunpowder was Guy Fawkes, one of a group of English catholics whose intention was to assassinate the protestant King James so that one of his young catholic children could assume the throne, thereby restoring a catholic monarchy.

Some 400 years later, the preservation of the monarchy and parliament is still celebrated by many with a bonfire and the burning of a guy.

Like other major events in British history, there is a link with The Hundred Parishes. In this case, the primary link is Sir William Waad (pronounced Wade) of 17th-century Battles Hall in the parish of Manuden.

Waad, who lived from 1546 to 1623, had pursued a distinguished career in the service of the Crown and in 1605 held the position of Lieutenant of the Tower of London, responsible for those held prisoner there and specifically for the interrogation of prisoners. The king gave permission for the use of torture, including the rack, to assist in this questioning. It was not long before most of the plotters were rounded up, interrogated, tried and executed by being publicly hung, drawn and quartered for their involvement in the Gunpowder Plot.

Manuden's most famous former resident is remembered on a tablet inside the parish church.

There is a second local link to the Gunpowder Plot. It is believed that Tiptofts, a 14th-century house in Wimbish, may have been used as a meeting place by the conspirators.

The Cenotaph Salesmen

And why Heydon does not have a War Memorial.

Great Chishill and Heydon are ancient settlements a mile apart, both remote villages high up on the chalk downland. The soil has always been poor but neolithic man settled here because of the springs from the aquifer that collects in between the chalk and the Gault clay. Great Chishill comprises about 600 people and Heydon smaller at about 250.

The Great War took its toll on both agricultural parishes. Twelve dead in Great Chishill and six in Heydon. In Great Chishill, three were from the same family and the same in Heydon - half their losses. In the days when harvesting was by hand, this created severe economic hardship amongst the bereaved families. Farmers were not charities and with tied cottages this could mean a bereaved family were 'out on the streets'.

Monumental masons had lean pickings during the Great War, as dead bodies were not, unlike in the US, repatriated to their homeland. The War Graves Commission buried them in communal graves with the headstones centrally sourced.

When the war ended the masons took their opportunity and employed commission-only cenotaph salesmen who visited the outlying villages. Cenotaphs were favoured by the government of the time, but it was left to the bereaved families to fund them. The cenotaph salesmen visited Great Chishill, harassing the bereaved families to pay for a cenotaph, 'to remember your fallen'. The 'guilt' caused paid off, with the erection of an obelisk. It remains at the crossroads, visible from my front windows, and a magnet on Remembrance Sunday for villagers and others choosing to remember the war.

The jungle drums worked swiftly between the two villages and Heydon was forewarned of the arrival of the cenotaph salesmen. Mrs Negus who had lost three able bodied sons was ready for them. As a small farmer she had more resources than her labourers. The salesman opened his sample book and said that, 'undoubtedly with her great loss and apparently in funds she would want to contribute 50% for a Heydon cenotaph'.

I paraphrase her reply. She said that, 'she would have nothing to do with





a cenotaph. That they were ugly and just reminded one of death. She would construct her own memorial inside the church, celebrating life - and he, the salesman, should get lost'. I think she used a ruder word!

Heydon has a small medieval church with a replacement tower replacing an ancient one which was bombed during the last war. However, inside at the back of the altar is a beautiful Tree of Life mosaic, in gold and with green mirrored tiles. It comes alive by candlelight. At its base is has a very small dedication, 'To all those fallen between 1914-19'. It is without doubt, the most beautiful memorial I have ever witnessed!

This is why, alone amongst our seven parish churches, Heydon does not have a war memorial.

Keep Warm this Winter

Rising fuel bills and other household expenses are putting pressure on many families' finances. But there are still ways in which you can cut costs.

If you rely on heating oil to heat your home it is more important than ever to shop around. If you have internet access, use a price comparison website such as www.boilerjuice.co.uk before



placing your order so you have a good idea of the going rate. Alternatively ring a few suppliers and ask for their 'best price' - don't assume they will automatically offer you their most competitive tariff and don't be afraid to haggle! Joining your local heating oil club can be another great way of finding savings. Speak to your Parish Council or neighbourhood group or go to www.uttlesford.gov.uk and search for 'oil clubs'.

The power market is changing rapidly at the moment. Many energy companies are struggling, so you won't find as many tariffs as normal. If you are coming to the end of a fixed price deal and can't find a better tariff than the one you're on it's probably better to roll onto the standard variable rate and wait, as you will currently be protected by energy regulator Ofgem's price cap.

If your energy supplier goes out of business, you'll still have gas and electricity. Don't switch tariff or supplier until your account is automatically moved to the new supplier as you might find it harder to get any money you're owed if you switch before this happens. In the meantime, take regular meter readings (keeping dated photos, if you can). If you have an online account, log into it, check your balance and download any bills, or keep paper bills instead.

If you can't access the information you need online or you need more specialist support, the energy specialists at Uttlesford Citizens Advice can offer advice on a range of areas, including winter benefits and cold weather payments, the warm home discount scheme, energy efficiency measures, home improvement grants, switching energy suppliers and the priority services register; they can also help people to manage fuel related debt and access emergency support if needed.
