What do Governors do?

When I joined the Chrishall School Governing Body I had no idea what it would involve but the Rector at the time, Andy Colebrooke, convinced me that it would be interesting. So 10 years later was he right?

At Chrishall the Governors are responsible for 3 main areas: overseeing the school's financial performance, planning the strategic direction of the school and maintaining and building on the school's reputation.

At this time of increasing costs much of our time is spent keeping a close eye on our budget. As a voluntary-aided school the Governors have the additional responsibility for all capital expenditure and finding the funds for at least 10% of any capital work required. Over the summer we had new toilets installed for Key Stage 1 and 2 (5-9 year old) children and new pipework throughout the school causing much delight to the Governors and staff. This delight is due to the project taking 10 years of annually submitted bids to the Diocese and 9 years of rejections when other schools had more urgent needs. It has also meant years of careful budgeting to be able to pay for our 10%. A frustrating process, not to mention expensive, but these toilets are now much prized.

We also paid for the new fencing around the school as this was an Ofsted requirement, but the Diocese were unable to provide funding. It will come as no surprise, therefore, that you will be seeing more fundraising events taking place over the next few years! We hope that many of these events will be held in the villages and be enjoyed by the whole community.

When we are not poring over budgets, we also spend time thinking of the direction we would like the school to move in and three years ago we formed a collaboration with Rickling and Farnham schools as they were looking for a new Headteacher. We saw the benefits of knowledge sharing across the teaching staff, sharing materials for classwork and planning and career opportunities for staff. The children of the three schools are able meet up for events such as

the annual pantomime, sports days and for collaborative working. The children's school councils share ideas for fundraising and improving their school experience and the combined school councils even had a trip to London for a tour of the Houses of Parliament which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

We also keep a close eye on our children's academic progression. We are very lucky to have an excellent team of experienced Teachers and Teaching Assistants who introduced new writing and phonics programmes two years ago. The staff have also implemented a new Religious Studies scheme of work which encourages children to discuss their learning as part of a big question at the end of the topic. And finally, the Governors also have a role to support the Headteacher, Tracey Bratley. The Headteacher role can be a lonely position and one with huge responsibility, not only for the school and the children but also for parents and staff. The Governors are a critical friend to the Head during the planning and forecasting for the school. Sometimes we are simply a friend.

Whilst there have been times that have been demanding or worrying, particularly during the Covid years, I feel privileged to be part of Chrishall School. Working with fantastic staff, fellow Governors and observing the children progress through the school after starting as tiny, muss-haired dots in pre-school or Reception. The children challenge themselves in ways that adults often stop doing. Then watching them leave excited about their next step on their educational journey. It's a joy. So, thank you Andy Colebrooke, you were right.


Annie Day grew up in Phoenix Cottage on Crawley End in Chrishall. Her husband, William Scripps, hailed from Barley. They were married, at Holy Trinity, Chrishall, in 1940. Annie and William lived at Phoenix Cottage and later took over the smallholding of Annie's father, Ted Day. Annie died in March 1998 and is buried at the church alongside William, who passed away two years earlier.



What's in a Field Name?

What's in a name? Well maybe more than first appears.

Field names might describe the size or type of field – the ten acre, the six acre, ploughed pightle, Well field. They might describe who owned the field at some point – Brands, Roberts Bit. But who were these people and why did they call their fields what they did?

For example in 1808 Chrishall fields came under the enclosure act and the land was measured and re-organised among the landowners to bring strips of land together and make the land plots more cohesive. If you look at the enclosure map you will see the name of the Honourable Thomas Brand written across a lot of the fields, but who was he? Did he live in the village?

These are just some of the questions I started to ask when looking at the field names. I didn't realise just how long it would take and how many stories would be unearthed (excuse the pun!). After a year's research I am giving a talk on what I have found. Is it all the answers? No. It's a contribution to the local knowledge, but a trawl through the Archives has brought up what I think are some great stories which I would love to tell you.
