**RDCT** 

Royston & District Community Transport

Royston and District Community Transport is a local charity. We have volunteer drivers using their own cars to "take you where you need to go".

The service is available to anyone over 60 and those with mobility problems and unable to use public transport. We charge 60p per mile to cover driver's expenses, with a minimum charge of £6.

The service is door-to-door, with the driver waiting for you, unless the appointment is over two hours (such as the eye clinic and some day procedures) in which case it would be a double run with the driver returning to pick you up at your request.

While the majority of our journeys are health related, we can usually offer other journeys such as to the hairdresser (or barbers), shopping trips and possibly social visits, depending on driver availability.

We do ask for at least two days

notice, to enable us to find a suitable driver. For more information, or to book a journey, please contact our office on 01763 245228.

## **DRIVERS WANTED**

Although we are covering the majority of our journey requests we always are need of volunteers to give flexibility and easier coverage.

As a volunteer you would let us know your availability — for example, some drivers can only do certain days, or just one day, but any additional help is always welcome.

We ask for at least a mid-size 4-door car, as many of our passengers have manoeuvring difficulty, and we would check if you can accommodate a wheelchair or walker aid. You would receive 50p per mile, which is the amount currently allowed as expenses under HMRC rules, with the mileage charge starting from your home.

# Directions to the SNOWDROP viewing on Saturday 8th February

If you are planning to come to this private 12-acre snowdrop reserve, the site is approximately 8 miles from Great Chishill located off the A10 between Foxton and Harston on the East Side. The reserve is up a farm track and there will be a person in a Hi-Vis jacket at the entrance. It is safer to approach the turning from the Harston direction where the entrance is on the left and easier to spot. Approaching from Foxton requires a right turn off the busy A10. The What Three Words code for the entrance is ///lifelong.rivals.issues. The post code is CB22 7NJ. The entrance has a sign 'CP2' and is just before Cambridge Plants coming from Harston.



There are thousands of snowdrops, all planted by hand over a period of 30 years. This is a unique opportunity as the site is threatened by the East West



rail link and may not be accessible in the near future. We plan to provide light refreshments, as before, or feel free to bring a picnic. Donations are requested.

There are still a few places available, please let us know how many people are interested and what time you are

likely to arrive. This will help spread out the traffic flow and give us contact details in the unlikely event we have to cancel due to the site being waterlogged.
