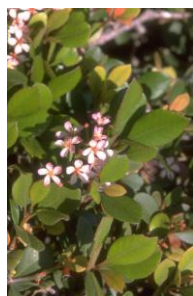

**GOOD NEWS FROM E-COPS**

Police launched Operation Astra after linking a number of thefts from vehicles in the south of the county and across East Anglia. A gang of four men carried out a six-month crime spree targeting vehicles parked at rural beauty spots and in school car parks. They netted thousands of pounds by withdrawing cash from stolen cards, as well as stealing handbags and other valuables. They also bought high-value goods from Argos stores in Cambridgeshire, Hertfordshire and Newmarket. Detectives linked the offenders through CCTV footage and put the men under intense surveillance. They were caught in Essex after being seen breaking into two vehicles a couple of miles away in Suffolk.

Two of the gang were jailed for 20 months; one was locked up for 15 months and the other given 12 months. The fifth was given six months, suspended for 18 months, and ordered to complete 250 hours of unpaid work.

**CRIMESTOPPERS** received nearly 600 pieces of actionable information over the past year (April 2010 - March 2011) about criminals operating in Cambridgeshire. This information assisted with 40 arrests.

Ann Scott, Eastern Regional Manager for Crimestoppers has expressed a huge thank you to the

people of Cambridgeshire for using the charity to pass on information about crime. As a result, 40 criminals have now been brought to justice who may have still been on the street without the charity's and public help.

Crimestoppers would like to reassure the public that their service is completely anonymous and in the 23 years that the charity's been running no one has ever been identified. The service is run for the public, to help make communities a safer place to live. Crimestoppers is not part of the Police or government, it's an independent charity, so by contacting them you'll never have to give a statement to the Police or go to court.

This year has seen a newly formed Cambridgeshire Crimestoppers volunteer group who has been involved in a number of successful events promoting Fearless the Crimestoppers brand for young people. Recently Crimestoppers offered a reward of up to £5,000 for information on a series of sexual assaults across Cambridge and the public responded very well. The appeal, which features on the charity's Most Wanted site, received extensive coverage in the media.

The support and involvement of local communities is essential to fighting crime in Cambridgeshire and I would encourage anyone with information about criminals operating within the county to contact police or if they do not wish to be identified to use Crimestoppers.
