Cricket

in Cambridgeshire is now 'open' to everyone.

What is meant by this? To quote the Cambridgeshire Cricket Association (CCA) "the guidelines allow junior players in Year 8 at school (Under 13 at midnight on 31st August in the year preceding the current season) to play in open age cricket...providing parental consent to play has been obtained prior to play...this requirement recognises the need for parents or guardians to be aware of the significance of allowing their young child to participate in open age cricket rather than purely junior cricket".

Great Chishill currently has a second eleven playing in the lower leagues of the CCA and we are always looking for new players, especially those who are covered by the above criteria (the ruling applies equally to boys or girls).

MELBOURN AND DISTRICT LIBRARY NEWS

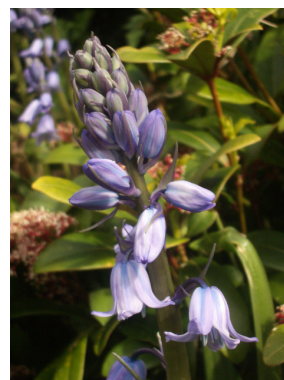
